Every Friday is a Mini-Lent

Here we are in the midst of the Easter season. But Good Friday is the day when Jesus Christ died on the Cross, and so *every* Friday in some small way commemorates His death just as *every* Sunday celebrates His Resurrection that took place on Easter Sunday.

And so, *every* Friday is like a mini-Lent, which means that we need to observe some measure of penance on *every* Friday. This actually is included in Canon Law. "All Christ's faithful are obliged by divine law, each in his or her own way, to do penance. However, so that all may be joined together in a certain common practice of penance, days of penance are prescribed." (Canon 1249) "The days and times of penance for the universal Church are each Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent." (Canon 1250)

So it is clear that *every* Friday is a day of penance. Catholics in the United States, while no longer required to abstain from meat *every* Friday, are nonetheless obliged to do penance of *some* sort *every* Friday. Penance on Fridays is obliged for all Catholics beginning at age 14, and there is no upper age limit on doing *something* for a Friday penance

How serious is this obligation? After Vatican II, Pope Blessed Paul VI issued a declaration on the necessity of penance in the Christian life. The "substantial observance binds *gravely*," he wrote, meaning that it is a grave sin to omit the obligation of *some* sort of penance.

What can we do for penance on Fridays? Well, we can abstain from meat. Yes, we are no longer *required* to do so, but that does not mean that we cannot voluntarily do so; our former bishop, Cardinal Cupich, always abstained from meat on Fridays. As another example, I myself pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday, even outside of Lent. We can abstain from sweets, we can abstain from Facebook or Instagram or whatever is your social media of choice. The point is that we do *something* as an act of penance on Fridays because, again, *every* Friday is a little commemoration of Good Friday, when Christ died on the Cross; *every* Friday is a mini-Lent.
