As summer begins, we also begin our summer catechesis series: Saint of the Week. We have done this the last two summers and are now doing it again. Each of the last two summers, we focused on saints whose memorials take place during the summer; this summer, we will focus on saints whose memorials take place in the fall and winter.

Our first Saint of the Week is St. Therese of Lisieux, whose memorial is October 1. She is also known as St. Therese of the Child Jesus (her religious name) and also as the "Little Flower."

"I prefer the monotony of obscure sacrifice to all ecstasies. To pick up a pin for love can convert a soul." These, her own words, describe her overall lifelong approach to active and intentional Christian discipleship. She was a Carmelite nun who lived a cloistered life of obscurity in the convent of Lisieux, France. And her preference for hidden sacrifice did indeed convert souls. Few saints are more popular than her. Her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*, is read and loved throughout the world.

She entered the convent at the age of 15 and died in 1897 at the age of 24. She was canonized in 1925, and two years later, she and St. Francis Xavier were declared co-patrons of the missions.

Life in a Carmelite convent is indeed uneventful and consists mainly of prayer and hard domestic work. But she possessed that holy insight that redeems the time, however dull that time may be. In her quiet suffering, she saw redemptive suffering, suffering that was indeed her apostolate. She came to the Carmel convent "to save souls and pray for priests." Shortly before she died, she wrote: "I want to spend my heaven doing good on earth."

On October 19, 1997, Saint John Paul II proclaimed her a Doctor of the Church, the third woman to be so recognized, in light of her holiness and the influence on the Church of her teaching on spirituality. Her parents, Louis and Zelig, were beatified in 2008, and there is tremendous hope and expecta-
