August 1 & 2. ~~Saint of the Week~~ ^{Saint of the Week} Fr. Jeff and our youth in prayer during their retreat week is St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, whose memorial is November 13. She is the first United States citizen to be canonized, having become a U.S. citizen in 1909. Her deep trust in the loving care of God gave her the strength to be a valiant woman doing the work of Christ.

She was invited by the religious order that had educated her to become a teacher for that same school where she herself had been taught, but she discerned instead to begin doing charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy. In September 1877, she made her vows there and took the religious habit. When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named her prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, and seven young women from the orphanage joined her.

Since her early childhood in Italy, she had wanted to be a missionary in China but, at the urging of Pope Leo XIII, she went west instead of east, traveling with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there. She found disappointment and difficulties at every turn. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. The archbishop advised her to return to Italy. But truly a valiant woman, she left the archbishop's residence all the more determined to establish her orphanage, which she did.

In 35 years, she founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Seeing great need among Italian immigrants who were losing their faith, she organized schools and adult education classes.

As a child, she was always frightened of water, unable to overcome her constant fear of drowning. Yet, despite this fear, she traveled across the Atlantic Ocean more than 30 times. At last, exhausted and sick from her long life of hard work, she succumbed to malaria and died in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago.

At her canonization on July 7, 1946, Pope Pius XII said, "Although her constitution was very frail, her spirit was endowed with such singular strength that, knowing the will of God in her regard, she permitted nothing to impede her from accomplishing what seemed beyond the strength of a woman." She is the patron saint of hospital administrators, immigrants, and impossible causes (such as finding a parking spot downtown in a big
