Family Faith Formation: Christ the King: Center of Our Life

Our *Family Faith Formation* home lesson topic this week is "Christ the King: Center of Our Life", covered in Questions 106-108 and 111-113 of *The Apostolate's Family Catechism*. Your packet is available on the parish website.

By Heart Catechism

- 106. What has Jesus Christ done for us through His Resurrection? When Christ passed from death to life, He made possible our own passing from the death of sin to life in Him.
- 108. What is the meaning of the Ascension of Christ? The Ascension means that Jesus' glorified body and soul, risen from the dead, now lives forever in Heaven.
- 111. How is Christ present with His Church? Through God the Holy Spirit, "another Advocate" and the "Paraclete." Christ, through the Holy Spirit, is especially present to us in the Sacraments, the Eucharist above all.
- 112. What plan does God have for humanity? God's plan for us is to carry out the work of salvation in the world, to "go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mk 16:15)

Corporal Acts of Mercy: Feeding the Hungry

As the Year of Mercy begins, Pope Francis is inviting bishops and priests all over the world to revisit the Church's rich teaching with regard to the Seven Corporal Acts of Mercy and the Seven Spiritual Acts of Mercy. And so, part of our answer to his call will be devoting our bulletin columns each week for the next fourteen weeks to each of these fourteen Acts of Mercy.

Mercy, first of all, might be defined as a virtue that influences one's will to have compassion for (and, if possible, to alleviate) another's misfortune. Acts of Mercy are actions of charity, and there are physical needs of others that we can tend to with Corporal (from the Latin "corpus," meaning "body") Acts of Mercy, and there are also spiritual needs of others (needs of their souls), which we tend to with Spiritual Acts of Mercy.

The first Corporal Act of Mercy is Feeding the Hungry. In our own parishes, the towns and communities where we live all seem to have remarkable programs for feeding the hungry. Our food pantries and food banks help many individuals and families each week, and efforts are underway to enhance these efforts even more, in cooperation with the Hunger Coalition and the Farmers' Markets. There is also the Meals on Wheels program, a program that enlists the help of volunteers who shop for the ingredients for meals to be prepared, other volunteers who actually prepare the meals, and still other volunteers who deliver the meals to those in need.

Our own parishes do what we can through the poor fund of St. Mary of the Rosary: the Good Samaritan Fund. Brenda offers us occasional updates on how many folks this Fund serves and also how much money we have remaining. Among other things that this parishbased program funds is Safeway gift cards

Last summer, St. Mary of the Rosary joined other churches and other non-profits in Chewelah to put on a summer meal program for children and families called TASTY. It was a huge success, which is remarkable considering that we did not obtain any grant funding for it until May, and we wanted TASTY to begin right after Chataqua. Many of our parishioners helped with TASTY, and we aim to do it again next summer.

These are just some of the many ways we can go about the first Corporal Act of Mercy: Feeding the Hungry. Our most urgent need in any of these efforts is, of course, volunteers. We need parishioners to step forward and help us in Feeding the Hungry and in all of our Social Outreach efforts. Please see Fr. Jeff if perhaps you are being called to help us in this regard!
