**The Eucharist Made Present**

Our *Family Faith Formation* home lesson topic this week is "The Eucharist Made Present", covered in Questions 236-237 and 239-240 of *The Apostolate's Family Catechism*. Your packet is on the parish website.

**By Heart Catechism**

237. **What is the Holy Spirit?** The Holy Eucharist is the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Under the appearance of bread and wine, the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ are really, truly, and substantially present for the nourishment of souls and as a sacrifice of the Church.

**Spiritual Act of Mercy:  
Admonishing the Sinner**

The third Spiritual Work of Mercy is Admonishing the Sinner. The overarching principle in admonishing sinners is "fraternal correction," by which we mean firm but patient chastisement of another person who is clearly in the wrong. The purpose of fraternal correction is helping another to reform bad behaviors, transforming vice into virtue, and if possible, preventing sin. This must be done in the spirit of fraternal charity, which stems from the natural law that binds us to love and to assist one another. So important, in fact, is fraternal correction that Jesus Christ actually commands it in the Gospel: "If your brother sins [against you], go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, so that every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses." (Mt 18:15-16)

Now before we become know-it-all busy-bodies who go around correcting everyone in sight, let us keep in mind crucial justifications that warrant our need to go about Admonishing the Sinner in fraternal correction:

- You observe bad behaviors that need to be corrected, and those behaviors are grievous;
- You have no good reason to believe that the sinner will correct him/herself;
- You have reasonable expectation that your admonition will be listened to;
- Nobody else but you is appropriate for the given situation or is likely to do it;
- You discern little or no risk of major repercussions as a result of your zeal for the good of the sinner

And again, your admonition of the sinner must be done privately, just as Jesus Himself tells us in the Gospel text cited above (i.e. you go directly to the sinner in private for admonition and not in the presence of others unless that is absolutely necessary). And you must be firm but patient and always in the spirit of fraternal charity.

And if you yourself are the sinner who is being admonished, hopefully you will have the humility to heed the admonition; being at the business-end of fraternal correction is an important means by which each of us grows in virtue and improves in character.
