### Saint of the Week

This week, our Saint of the Week is St. Cyril of Jerusalem, whose Memorial is March 18, bishop-patriarch of Jerusalem in the 4th Century and Doctor of the Church.

The crises that the Church faces today are actually very minor compared with the threat posed by the Arian heresy, which denied the divinity of Christ and almost overcame Christianity in the 4th Century. St. Cyril was to be caught up in the controversy, accused (later) of Arianism by St. Jerome but ultimately vindicated both by the men of his own time and by being declared a Doctor of the Church in 1822.

St. Cyril was raised in Jerusalem, well-educated (especially in Sacred Scripture), and was ordained a priest by the bishop of Jerusalem and given the task of catechizing during Lent those preparing for Baptism. During the Easter season, his famed catechesis continued with the newly baptized. His *Catecheses* remain valuable as examples of the ritual and theology of the Church in the mid-4th Century.

There are conflicting reports about the circumstances of his becoming bishop-patriarch of Jerusalem. It is certain that he was validly consecrated by bishops of that province. Since one of them was an Arian, Acacius, it may have been expected that his "cooperation" would follow. But conflict soon rose between St. Cyril and Acacius. St. Cyril was summoned to a council, where he was accused of insubordination and of selling Church property to relieve the poor. However, it is probably that a theological difference was also involved. He was condemned on all charges, driven from Jerusalem, but later vindicated. Half of his episcopate was spent in exile, and when he finally returned to Jerusalem, he found his people torn with heresy, schism, and strife, and the city itself wracked with crime. Even St. Gregory of Nyssa, sent to help him, left in despair.

St. Cyril went to the Ecumenical Council of Constantinople, where the amended form of the Nicene Creed was promulgated in the year 381. St. Cyril accepted the word *consubstantial* (that is, of Christ and the Father), and the bishops of the Council praised him as a champion of orthodoxy against the Arians.
