Sacred Heart, Immaculate Heart

There is an old tradition in the homes of Catholic families that, sadly, seems to have fallen away but which hopefully might return to our own parish families as a result of the First-Friday Sacred Heart devotion and the First-Saturday Marian devotion that we have in our parishes.

That tradition is the Home Enthronement of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This enthronement restores Christ to the family, the Domestic Church. It begins with a beautiful ceremony in the home itself: the family's priest presides at the ceremony and the family publicly and solemnly acknowledges that Christ is King and the loving Master of the home. This is done by having the family install a picture or a statue of the Sacred Heart in a place of honor in the main room of the home. After this "enthronization," the family members consecrate themselves to the Sacred Heart, thereby pledging themselves to live as though the Sacred Heart were actually dwelling in their midst as He did at Nazareth, His own home with His own Holy Family.

Thus begins a new life of faith for the family: loving obedience to the commands of Christ and His Church; frequent family prayer; Mass; regular confession. This enthronement restores the family to Christ because it deliberately and solemnly places Christ first above all things.

Part of this ceremony often includes a similar enthronement for the Immaculate Heart of Mary, which would then solemnly establish the Blessed Virgin Mary as our most supreme prayer-warrior and intercessor.

Families are encouraged to do this on a day of special significance for the family (a wedding anniversary, for example), or on an appropriate liturgical feast day. The better and more serious the preparation for the Home Enthronement, the greater will be the blessings on the family that come from this event. The family can even extend this celebration over three days (a triduum) or even nine days (a novena).
